SUBJECT: PY 2012-13 RAPID RESPONSE FUNDING AWARDS AND EXPANDED FLEXIBILITY

This Information Notice announces the formula-based Rapid Response (RR) funding awards provided to Local Workforce Investment Areas (LWIA) for the period July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2013. The attachment shows the total funding amount for each LWIA in the right hand column.

Each award of funds should be used to defray the cost of required and allowable RR activities in response to layoffs, business closures, and natural disasters. Expenditures for activities described in Sections 665.310, 665.320, and 667.262(b) of the federal regulations (20 CFR Part 652) will be reimbursed under the formula RR grant code. Other activities not described in these sections must be paid with other WIA funds or with non-WIA funds.

The formula RR funds will be placed in either grant code 540 or 541. Consistent with other WIA allocations, these funds will not be available until the State receives federal spending authority for them.

As explained in Draft Directive WSDD-72, use of this funding is hereby expanded to allow for the provision of direct services to dislocated workers. The funds may be used for either RR or Additional Assistance purposes. When serving Additional Assistance participants with these funds, they are to be registered under grant code 241. Funds used on training services when serving Additional Assistance participants qualifies as "leveraged resources." It is the State's hope that, to the extent possible, LWIAs will use these funds to provide training to the large number of long-term unemployed individuals seeking services and consequently, this will assist LWIAs in meeting the 25 percent training expenditure requirement as described in Directive [WSD11-9](#). Additionally, any unspent PY 2011-12 RR funding is extended to June 30, 2013, and can also be used for RR or Additional Assistance as determined by local needs.
