



DISABILITY EMPLOYMENT ACCELERATOR 2017-18 AWARDS

The Employment Development Department (EDD), in coordination with the California Workforce Development Board, and on behalf of the Labor and Workforce Development Agency, is pleased to announce the awarding of \$2 million in grants for the Disability Employment Accelerator (DEA) program. The DEA program will focus on creating linkages and engaging businesses in high-growth industries. Funds will connect applicants and employers in nine California regions: Amador, Calaveras, Contra Costa, Los Angeles, Mariposa, Merced, Santa Barbara, Solano, and Tuolumne. Seven workforce development agencies were selected for funding.

All seven entities submitted proposals that were selected via a competitive process. Entities receiving funding will strive to use these business linkages to develop “earn and learn” service strategies (e.g., Work Experience, Transitional Jobs, On-the-Job Training, etc.) to ensure that people with disabilities have the necessary skills to obtain and retain competitive, integrated employment. A major objective of the DEA is to ensure people with disabilities, including college graduates, have the necessary work-based skills to obtain and retain competitive, integrated employment that offers a career path to advancement. The EDD expects that the performance period will be up to 24 months.
