\*This amount represents total worker contributions, less refunds. For example, in 2020, total worker contributions are the amount collected as a result of employers withholding 1.0 percent of all wages for each employee, up to a maximum of \$1,229.09 (1.0 percent of \$122,909, the taxable wage ceiling). However, if an employee worked for more than one employer, the total withheld in 2020 may exceed \$1,229.09. The employee would then be eligible for a refund of the amount exceeding \$1,229.09. Refunds are claimed as a credit on the California personal income tax return. Individuals not required to file personal income tax returns may file for refunds with the Employment Development Department.

**The information noted above does not include contributions from workers who are covered for SDI but whose employer administers a Voluntary Plan in lieu of the State Plan.**
